

As each CAMp is unique in itself, this was no exception. We started out small but by Saturday, we had a good size group. We had many participants coming and going due to other camps, work, and school schedules. We had 24 participants accomplish 212 hours of volunteer time during this past CAMp.

The workload was much lighter at this CAMp than it has been in the past. We had an opportunity to help Center for Children and Families (CCFI) clean all the toys in three rooms, and entertain senior citizens at Full Circle Senior Citizen's Day Care Center, as well as help with some smaller projects. The CAMpers helped cut out UPC codes and sort donations from local merchants, which were then passed out to other non-profit agencies that could use the donations. From there we went to the Arbor House Assistant Living Center to help celebrate four resident's birthdays. This was one of the favorite things for many of the participants for this CAMp. We had about an hour where we each visited with a different senior and had an opportunity to learn about their lives. We found out that one couple has been married for 70 years (He is 93 and she is 91 years old!) We had some great time discussing all the inventions that have made life easier over the past 50 years: indoor restrooms, washing machines, telephones, transportation, and electricity.

On Friday, we shared all kinds of silly, wacky games with the kids that were attending Camp David. Below is a note from their director:
